BRIDGER TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES FOR A REGULAR MEETING HELD ON JUNE 4, 2019

The June 4, 2019 meeting of the Bridger Town Council was held at 108 South D Street in Bridger. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the meeting was called to order by Councilman Wilm at 7:02 pm, Mayor Shultz was absent. Council members present were George "Butch" Wilm, Shala Cullum, Mark DeRudder and Doug Asbury. Others present were Crystal Schober, Daran Shafer, Library Director Krystal Zentner, Assistant Public Works Director (APWD) Randy Novakovich, Sargent Codi Peters and Clerk Kirstin Sweet.

The first item on the agenda was public comment. There was no public comment from the gallery.

Next on the agenda was correspondence. There was no correspondence.

Next on the agenda was the approval of the minutes from the May meeting. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Councilwoman Cullum, seconded by Councilman Asbury. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Wilm – aye, Councilwoman Cullum – aye, Councilman DeRudder – aye and Councilman Asbury – aye.

The next item of business was the approval of claims. Councilwoman Cullum motioned to approve claims with check numbers #31967 to #32001. Electronic check numbers #-98412 to #-98408. The motion was seconded by Councilman DeRudder. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Wilm – aye, Councilwoman Cullum – aye, Councilman DeRudder – aye and Councilman Asbury – aye.

The next item was the Payroll Summary. Councilwoman Cullum motioned to approve the Payroll Summary including check numbers #31915 to #31917 and #31959 to #31966. Also, electronic checks #-87360 to #-87323. The motion was seconded by Councilman DeRudder. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Wilm – aye, Councilman Cullum – aye, Councilman DeRudder – aye and Councilman Asbury – aye.

Committee reports was the next item on the agenda. Councilwoman Cullum reported that she was unable to make it to the hazard mitigation planning committee meeting. However, in her absence she did send DES Coordinator Tom Kohley information regarding concerns for our area.

The next agenda item was a special events application. Councilman Wilm read the application for the Seth and Micheal Memorial Softball Tournament. A motion to approve was made by Councilman Asbury, seconded by Councilwoman Cullum. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Wilm – aye, Councilwoman Cullum – aye, Councilman DeRudder – aye and Councilman Asbury – aye. The second application was from Bridger Youth Rodeo. Councilman Wilm read the application. A motion to approve was made by Councilwoman Cullum, seconded by Councilman DeRudder. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Wilm – aye, Councilwoman Cullum – aye, Councilman DeRudder – aye and Councilman Asbury – aye. The third application was from the Jim Bridger Days Truck Pull and Derby. Councilman Wilm read the application. There was some discussion regarding extra dumpsters for the event. APWD Novakovich said he would see if he could get some extras from someone in town. Chief Buechler was not present so security costs are to be determined. A motion to approve was made by Councilman DeRudder and seconded by Councilman Asbury. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Wilm – aye, Councilwoman Cullum – aye, Councilman DeRudder – aye and Councilman Asbury – aye.

Next on the agenda was the rodeo grounds. APWD Novakovich gave an update on the crows nest.

The next agenda item was the factory building. There were no updates.

Attorney Freeman was not present.

Judge Kraft was not present.

Library Director Zentner reminded everyone that the book sale is coming up. The summer reading program has started. There should be an adult education portion this year.

Assistant Public Works Director Novakovich gave an update on the opening of the swimming pool and the new pump.

Sargent Peters presented the stats for the month of May.

Clerk Sweet informed the council that we would need a special meeting to accept or deny the quote for the presumptive coverage for the firefighter's work comp.

Mayor Shultz was not present.

There being no further business Councilman DeRudder motioned to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Councilman Asbury.
